

Welcome to Madrid

Maximum venue capacity has been reduced. Face masks are mandatory and social distancing rules must be followed at all times. The centre has hand sanitiser dispensers and has implemented enhanced cleaning processes.

Devoted to the exhibition of plastic arts, created by diverse artists from the last third of the 19th century through to just after the Second World War, this hall, opened in 2008, is located in a building constructed between 1881 and 1884 by the architect, Agustín Ortiz de Villajos, for the Duchess of Medina de Torres. The Espacio Miró, a hall that offers a permanent exhibition of the great artist from Catalonia, Joan Miró, is next to it.

The building originally consisted of a height of four floors and semi-basement, but in 1910 two towers were built in the corners. After a series of refurbishment and restructuring projects, the building now has an exhibition area with an approximate surface of 1,000 m², divided into three halls.

This foundation organises painting, sculpture and drawing exhibitions with a focus on the period spanning from the last third of the 19th century to after World War II.

Mapfre Foundation has another exhibition hall in Madrid called Sala Bárbara de Braganza. Located very close to Sala Recoletos, it is dedicated to the great masters of photography.



Accessibility

Physical Accesibility

There is an access ramp to our exhibition halls. The hall is divided into three floors: Floor -1, Ground Floor and 1st Floor, with an accessible itinerary by means of a lift. Its width enables easy movement between floors.

The entrance door for the disabled is double leaf and is 1.80 m wide, accessible for all wheelchairs.

There is an accessible toilet on the Ground Floor for exclusive use by disabled people, marked with the International Symbol of Access (ISA). On the same floor, there is a wheelchair on loan to make the visit easier, which must be requested from the security staff at the entrance.
