INTRODUCTION

The capital of art, music, sport, gastronomy... Madrid can be whatever city you want it to be. It's a place that keeps moving forward without losing sight of its unique identity. During the first months of the year, while the city hosted a series of major events, Madrid welcomed a number of exciting new projects. Some, such as Metrópolis, have brought historic buildings back to life by combining luxury accommodation with outstanding dining, while others have extended the range of experiences available beyond the city centre.

At the same time, iconic restaurants have returned to the streets of the capital, major fashion brands have just arrived and renowned chefs from Spain's culinary scene and further afield have chosen Madrid for their latest ventures. Recipes, flavours and food traditions have made their way to Madrid from Cádiz, Barcelona, the Basque Country, Mexico, Argentina, Italy, Japan, France and Lebanon, further enriching the city's gastronomic landscape.

They've been joined by a new generation of chefs and entrepreneurs who continue to drive the city's culinary and cultural life in districts such as Arganzuela and Carabanchel, while Chamberí, Centro and Barrio de Salamanca continue to broaden their appeal. And this is only the beginning.

The year ahead will bring major events, including the Formula 1 Spanish Grand Prix, concerts by internationally acclaimed artists, the eagerly awaited reopening of the Sorolla Museum and the opening of Nobu Hotel, part of the luxury brand co-founded by actor Robert De Niro. Sport, music, culture and luxury... There's room for every kind of experience in Madrid. The city that never stops reinventing itself.

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ACCOMMODATION



MERCER MADRID

Mercer Hotels makes its Madrid debut at No. 5 Calle de Ruiz de Alarcón, on one of the capital's most distinguished streets, in the historic former headquarters of what was once Spain's national sugar company. Designed by architect Enrique María Repullés y Vargas, the hotel brings a contemporary, sophisticated and sustainable vision to this landmark building. It offers 61 exclusive rooms and suites, all featuring oak floors and walnut joinery. Its wellness facilities include a 24-hour gym and a spa which features a water area and personalised treatments.

As for dining, the hotel is home to La Sociedad Gastronomika (named after the sugar company) by Eneko Atxa, the Basque chef whose restaurant Azurmendi boasts three Michelin stars and one Green Star. Rooted in health, sustainability and social responsibility, the restaurant's cuisine draws on local produce, seasonality and Basque tradition, all reinterpreted through a contemporary lens.

METRÓPOLIS

After years of lying dormant, the iconic Metrópolis Building has been reborn as a luxury hotel and private members' club. This grand reopening revives the cosmopolitan spirit in which the building was originally conceived at the dawn of the 20th century, just as Gran Vía avenue—which begins at its very doors—was starting to take shape.

Each of its 19 rooms has a character of its own, with interior décor inspired by different Spanish artists. Carefully considered design and works of art come together throughout the hotel, creating a dialogue with the building's history and original architecture. Reflecting its luxury ethos, the establishment offers a range of exclusive services catering to each guest, including a personal shopper, private dining experiences, a butler service on request and priority reservations at all Grupo Paraguas restaurants.

The experience is completed by seven dining concepts, each offering a contemporary, shareable take on local flavours with international influences. Alongside exclusive wellness spaces, the hotel also invites both guests and private club members to discover Madrid through tailor-made experiences.

NÔMADE TEMPLE MADRID

In the heart of the city, Nômade Temple Madrid breathes new life into the former Hotel de las Letras, a historic early 20th-century building reimagined as a sanctuary for visitors and locals alike. Within this vibrant space, heritage, design and culture converge.

Conceived as a creative retreat, the hotel seamlessly brings together accommodation, gastronomy, wellness, music, celebration and a carefully curated arts programme, establishing itself as an open meeting place for everyone in the city. Its dining spaces have a bohemian, eclectic feel and include a restaurant, café, speakeasy bar and nightclub, as well as a rooftop and poolside bar with spectacular views over the city.

URBAN HIVE MADRID

Urban Hive opens in Plaza de Santo Domingo, right in the centre of Madrid. The hotel reimagines a historic 1954 building that originally served as a vital, landmark hub for the Spanish telecommunications company, Telefónica. Its legacy is reflected in the hotel's core concept: "where calls were once connected, people now connect".

The establishment features 144 rooms that combine contemporary design with warm textures, creating a welcoming, personal retreat. Guests can also experience three leisure and dining spaces, each boasting its own identity: GINA Restaurant, where the menu centres around a stone oven; GINA Bar, dedicated to speciality coffee, aperitifs and signature cocktails and featuring an inner courtyard with vertical gardens; and GINA Oasis, a rooftop space with an infinity pool and panoramic views over the capital, ideal for snacks, sunsets and special gatherings. The hotel also has four modular event rooms, which are designed to adapt to various different formats within a modern, versatile setting in the heart of the city.

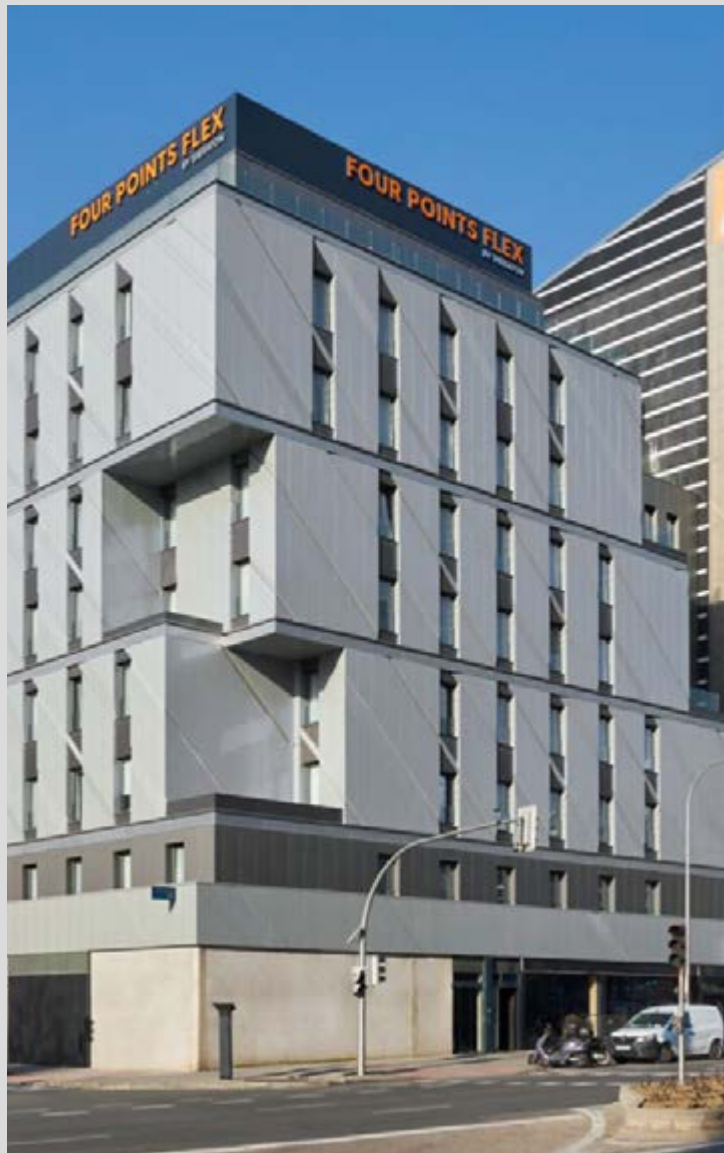


BYPILOW CALLAO

This is thanks to Bypillow, which has opened its seventh hotel in Madrid. Set in the same building as the historic Cines Callao cinema, this boutique hotel features 16 rooms spread across six floors. HOTEL 101

This is the first European venture from the Filipino group DoubleDragon: a 680-room hotel in Valdebebas serving as the official hotel of the Formula 1 Grand Prix, which will be coming to the capital on 11-13 September 2026. The rooms—dubbed “HappyRooms”—offer standard accommodations built around comfort, while the hotel also features meeting spaces, an outdoor pool, a gym and a children’s playground. It will soon welcome HBNB Kitchen by Grupo La Sucursal, a concept rooted in the Valencian restaurant group’s 50-plus years of culinary expertise.

LA FONDA DE LOS PRÍNCIPES

This hotel first opened its doors in 1861 and became one of the few establishments of its kind in Puerta del Sol. Over the years, it changed names several times before finally ceasing operations as Hostal Americano in 2020. Now, exactly 165 years since it first opened for business, it has been relaunched as a four-star boutique hotel under its original name. Spanning two floors, the hotel features 39 rooms, along with a restaurant-cocktail bar open to both guests and visitors alike that boasts views of the iconic clock atop the Real Casa de Correos building.

RESTAURANTS



LOS GABRIELES

Founded in 1907, Los Gabrieles was once one of Madrid's most emblematic restaurants—protected as part of the city's historic heritage thanks to its remarkable ceramic interior. After remaining closed for more than 20 years, this cultural, artistic and gastronomic landmark has reopened at No. 17 Calle de Echegaray, ready to become a meeting place once again in the Literary Quarter (Barrio de las Letras).

The restoration has preserved the ceramic murals that once earned the restaurant the title of “the Sistine Chapel of Andalusian tiles”, while contemporary artists have also contributed new works to the space. Its different areas—including the tavern, restaurant and private rooms—remain, pairing the beauty of its tiles with a menu inspired by traditional recipes and popular dishes that bring together Madrid and Andalusian cooking.

Los Gabrieles also keeps alive its original character as a gathering place for artists and intellectuals, from Pedro Almodóvar and Ava Gardner to Federico García Lorca. Today, it seeks to revive that convivial spirit with a programme of live music.

LA SOCIEDAD GASTRONOMIKA

This is the latest Madrid project from Basque chef Eneko Atxa. The restaurant is located at No. 5 Calle de Ruiz de Alarcón, inside the newly opened five-star Grand Luxury Mercer Hotel Madrid. The hotel occupies a former palace built in 1905, once home to Spain's national sugar company.

The restaurant is divided into three spaces: an intimate dining room with an open kitchen and seating for 12 guests, a second area for 24 diners and a private wine cellar with space for 16 guests.

The culinary experience centres on a single tasting menu that brings together Atxa's most innovative creations and some of Basque cuisine's best-known dishes, including *pil-pil* hake cheeks with teardrop peas.

EL CAMPERO

This historic restaurant from Barbate, in Cádiz, has opened a new Madrid outpost. A national benchmark for bluefin tuna, El Campero now has a home in the heart of the Barrio de Salamanca neighbourhood, at No. 148 Calle de Lagasca, in a restored 19th-century mansion arranged over three floors and with an outdoor garden.

The Madrid restaurant brings the same philosophy and menu as the legendary original, with interiors inspired by the *ronqueo*, the traditional cutting of the tuna. Led by chef Julio Vázquez, the menu explores the many ways to enjoy almadraba bluefin tuna. It ranges from raw preparations, such as tuna and truffle toast or a sashimi trilogy of loin, *tarantelo* and *ventresca*, to dishes cooked over fire or on the grill.

Traditional stews also have their place, with highlights such as tuna with tomato, *mor-mo*—a prized cut from the upper part of the tuna's head—cooked with onions, and roasted tuna ribs. The menu also includes other seafood and carefully sourced meats.

Grupo Mosh, one of the biggest names in Marbella's leisure and dining scene, has arrived in Madrid with this restaurant and club that promises to shake up the city's nightlife. Located at No. 61 Calle de José Abascal, its décor blends Venetian romanticism with striking Brutalist features. Art and design are central to its identity, with pieces by various artists rotated every six months. The kitchen is led by Franco Franceschini, the group's executive chef, who has created a sharing menu that includes Angus short ribs, sole *meunière* and Grandma Nelly's flan. At night, the restaurant is transformed into a club.

ALETEO

Aleteo is the Rocacho group's fourth restaurant in Madrid. Specialising in seafood, its menu revolves around grilled shellfish and fish, with highlights including the Ibiza-style lobster, velvet crabs in salt and brothy rice. As for the wine list, there are over 200 references to choose from. The restaurant features a generous dining room space, a bar and a terrace, with the kitchen running continuously throughout the day. It's located at the corner of No. 4 Calle de María de Molina and Paseo de la Castellana.

ALFONSINO

With over 20 restaurants across Mexico, the United States and Spain, the Edo Kobayashi group—founded by Mexican chef and entrepreneur Edo López—has opened Madrid's first standing *onigiri* bar, located at No. 25 Calle de Cardenal Cisneros. With space for just 14 guests, this intimate restaurant operates on a walk-in basis and offers a singular Japanese dining experience: a bar where watching the chefs prepare each bite is as rewarding as the cuisine itself.

ALMARA

Located at No. 62 Paseo de la Castellana, this new restaurant specialises in Mediterranean cuisine and features an elegant yet welcoming contemporary setting. Part of Grupo La Fábrica, it serves as a tribute to the elements of sea, fire and earth, with an emphasis on quality ingredients and time-honoured recipes reimaged for today. The menu, created by Navarre-born chef Aitor Mena, boasts dishes such as *txangurro* (spider crab) cannelloni, red tuna *parpatana* with Oloroso sherry, and grilled sea bass. Sharing options include white prawn croquettes with tartare sauce, *pil-pil* cod omelette, and steak tartare served with potato *mille-feuille*. There's also a bar menu available and an extensive wine list showcasing some of Spain's most celebrated wine regions.

AMATERASU

At this *omakase* experience—where diners let the chef surprise them instead of choosing their own dishes—Japanese technique meets Nikkei cuisine. This exclusive concept can be found within Hotaru, a sushi bar located at No. 99 Calle de Alcalá, and is designed for just 16 diners, with two sittings per day. In addition to the 12-course menu and wine pairing, guests can enjoy a selection of teas and a range of sakes.

ÁRDIA

Alicante-born chef Nazario Cano—already celebrated for his Michelin-starred restaurant Odiseo in Murcia—returns to Madrid with this highly personal venture that brings together three distinct experiences under one roof at No. 4B Callejón de Puigcerdà. The ground floor is a tribute to vermouth and Madrid's tapas culture, which guests can enjoy all day long. Upstairs, the first floor dining room showcases a menu focused on fire and grilling, with dishes such as lobster rice, grilled monkfish with finely sliced potatoes and Basque garlic sauce, and grilled cauliflower with burrata hummus. And finally, the penthouse is home to a space called ÂM-BAR—a cocktail lounge that takes guests on a liquid journey across Spain through a selection of signature drinks.

ARMANDO

This project from the Familia La Ancha group—the team behind La Ancha, Fismuler and Las Tortillas de Gabino—began life as a home-delivery service in 2020, created to bring one of the group's signature dishes, the Armando escalope, straight to customers' homes. It has now taken the next step by opening its first restaurant at No. 9 Calle de Carranza, close to Glorieta de Bilbao roundabout. The menu features the classic pork escalope alongside variations made with chicken, fish or vegetables, served with a range of toppings and sides, from truffled eggs and macaroni with chorizo to melted cheese. Other dishes include croquettes, Russian salad, Spanish omelette and a tasty burger.

BAS RESTAURANTE

Argentinian chefs Juan Patricio Campbell, of Natif café, and Gastón Dahir, formerly of Santerra, have opened their own restaurant beside El Retiro Park, at No. 41 Calle de Lope de Rueda, bringing together their experience and creative flair. With a short, focused menu, they take diners around the world while staying close to the recipes and techniques that have shaped their careers. Original creations include Argentine roasted meat croquettes, crumbly biscuits filled with *pâté*, apple and pickled grapes, free-range squab with corn, vine leaves and barley, and a *mille-feuille* of fermented plums with Arbequina toffee and celery and lime ice cream.

CASA CLAVEL

This historic Malasaña venue, long known as one of the neighbourhood's essential late-night bars on Corredera Baja de San Pablo, has been reinvented as a restaurant open from midday (on weekends; during the week it opens later) [T2.1]until after dinner. Its relaxed menu blends traditional and contemporary flavours, with olive, anchovy and pepper skewers known as *gildas*, Russian salad, cheese and charcuterie boards, sandwiches, wines and cocktails.

Vega Members Club is one of the latest private clubs to open in Madrid. Created by Íñigo Onieva, of Casa Salesas and Lula Club, together with investor Manuel Campos, the club is located at No. 88 Calle de Lagasca and also includes this restaurant, which is open to the public. Casa Vega is a sophisticated European-inspired bistro that offers a taste of this exclusive world, with no membership required. Its menu gives classic dishes a contemporary, international twist, with options such as the Salesas potato omelette, Iberian pastrami and truffle *bikini* (toasted sandwich), and *rigatoni alla vodka*.

At No. 54 Calle de Alcalá, just a few steps from El Retiro Park, Lebanese group Em Sherif opens its first restaurant in Spain. Founded in Beirut in 2011, the group brings its Lebanese cooking to Madrid with a menu inspired by family traditions, seasonal ingredients and dishes made for sharing. Traditional mezze include hummus, *mutabal*, *falafel* and *fatayer*, and more, while grilled skewers and other heartier classics complete the offering. The setting is contemporary, elegant and welcoming.

FLORENTINE

WOW Concept Serrano has opened the seventh floor of its shopping centre with Florentine, an Italian *trattoria* from Urban Italian Group. Inspired by the glamour of 1970s Italy, the décor sets the scene for a menu that pairs classic Italian flavours with modern techniques, featuring dishes designed for sharing. The highlight is its spectacular terrace, which offers panoramic views over Madrid's Golden Mile.

Georgian chef and restaurateur Nino Kiltava, founder of Nunuka and co-founder of Persimmon's cocktail bar, is behind this new project: an all-day canteen where the food of her homeland takes centre stage. Located in Las Salesas, at No. 11 Calle de San Lucas, K'era invites guests to discover Georgian culture around the table. The space has the feel of a true Georgian home, whether you come for a quiet breakfast, an impromptu lunch, a long, extended lunch or simply a glass of wine. At its heart is the traditional oven, used to prepare the restaurant's doughs and breads.

KELI

In Spanish slang, keli means home, and this restaurant on the corner of Paseo de la Castellana and Calle de Ayala has opened with the spirit of a Madrid home. Its philosophy is simple: relaxed meals, Spanish recipes and home-grown produce, all with the aim of bringing the country's traditions back to the table. The menu moves between old-style stews—such as *patatas a la importancia* potatoes, lentil soup and brothy rice—and timeless favourites, from Russian salad, creamy *croquetas* and baby squid in its ink to chicken pepitoria, Manchego-style ratatouille with poached egg and Madrid-style red snapper.

LA EMBAJADA DE SERRANO

Fans of the traditional potato omelette now have a new must-visit spot in Madrid. Chef Nicolás Reyes, who spent more than ten years at Cañadío, a restaurant renowned for its *tortilla de patatas*, has launched this personal project alongside several partners. Conceived as a classic neighbourhood restaurant, it's a place to drop in for a midday drink and a snack (or, *aperitivo*), lunch, or dinner. The star dish is a creamy potato omelette made with confit onion, available both at the bar and in the dining room. The rest of the menu draws on the chef's Chilean and Cantabrian roots, with dishes for all tastes and a different stew available each day, all designed to make it a firm neighbourhood favourite.

LUIGI'S RESTAURANTE

This new *trattoria* on Madrid's Glorieta de Bilbao brings Italian cooking together with playful references to one of the most iconic video games of the 1980s and 1990s, from the décor to the original cocktails. The result is a colourful, light-hearted trip back in time, served alongside a menu rooted in Italian tradition: fresh pasta, slow-fermented pizzas, original sauces and distinctive ingredients from Italy.

Food, cocktails, wine and music come together at this unique venue in the heart of the Goya neighbourhood, at No. 71 Calle de Jorge Juan. The space is divided into three areas—a bar, private dining room and events room—where guests can enjoy a creative menu that explores flavours and techniques from around the world, alongside a carefully chosen wine selection and original cocktails. Vinyl sessions complete the atmosphere, with sounds ranging from reggae and R&B to soul and electronic music.

MEMORIES

At No. 18 Calle de la Princesa, the former stables of Liria Palace have been reborn as Memories—a restaurant where gastronomy, design and music meet. The décor brings the past into the present with a distinctly contemporary eye. In the private dining rooms, Madrid's La Movida movement is celebrated through collages made from original posters from the 1980s and 1990s, rescued from the streets of the city. In the kitchen, Mediterranean roots meet international influences in dishes such as steak tartare and potato salad with scarlet prawn tartare and caviar. The experience continues late into the night with DJ sessions.

ÔME | Taller Gastronómico

The Barrio de Salamanca neighbourhood, specifically No. 6 Calle de Lombía, welcomes a new destination for Mexican cuisine. ÔME | Taller Gastronómico is the personal project of chef Roberto Ortiz Blanco, who trained in Mexico City before working in the kitchens of such leading names as El Bulli, Arzak, Mugaritz and Punto MX. Here, he offers three ways to enjoy a contemporary menu built around corn: the ÔMEKASE Bar, inspired by the Japanese concept of *omakase*, where the chef selects the dishes each day according to the season, the produce available and his own creative vision; the Chef's Table, with a tasting menu; and the Dining Room, where the menu is designed for sharing.

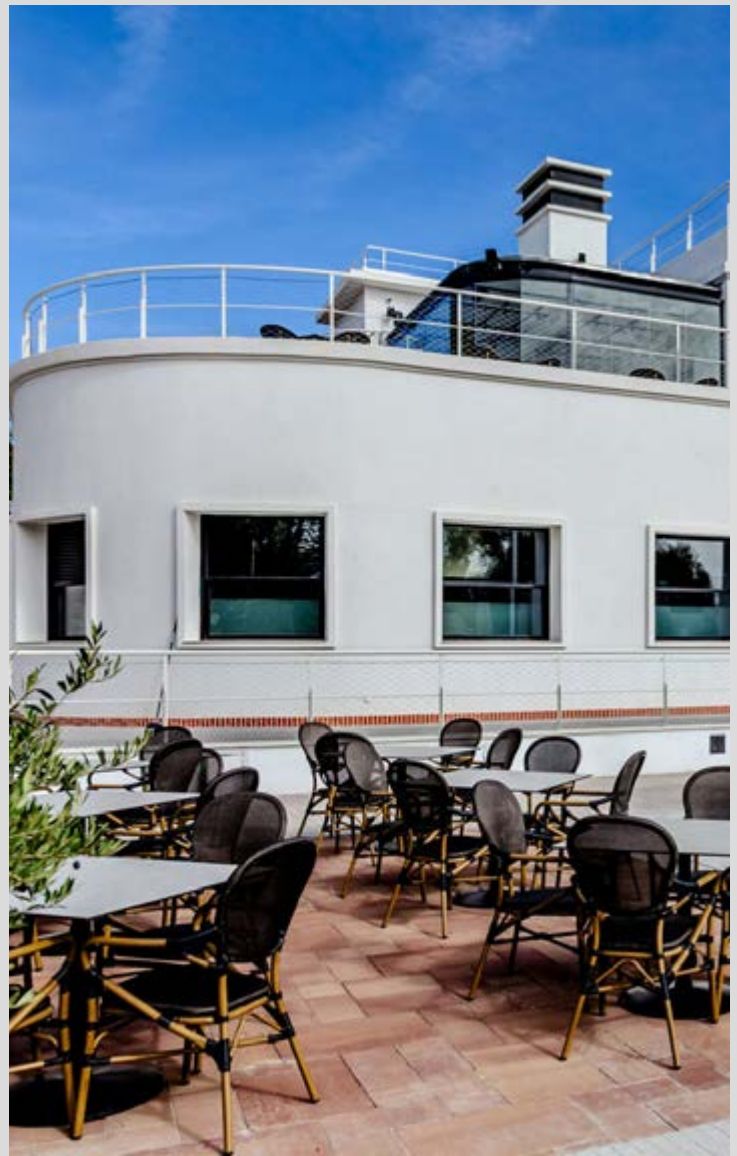


ORIGINE

Italian chef Salvatore Romano, whose restaurant Tòto e Peppino has been a Madrid favourite for more than 20 years, has opened a new venture of his own at No. 36 Calle de Rafael Calvo, built around flavour, tradition and, as its name suggests, origins. The result is traditional Italian cooking that also pays tribute to Spain through locally sourced produce and ingredients. This fusion comes through in dishes such as carbonara with *txistorra* sausage and lamb lasagne. One of the highlights is the *pade-llino*, a type of long-fermented pizza from Turin.

PLAYA DE MADRID

Hospitality group El Enfriador has brought one of Madrid's historic sites back to life: Spain's first artificial beach. Opened in 1932 beside the River Manzanares, at No. 31 Carretera del Pardo, it was originally a leisure complex with a reservoir, sand, boats and sports areas. The main building from that original project is still standing and has now been transformed into a restaurant whose name pays tribute to this iconic Madrid landmark. Alongside a large main dining room and two terraces, the restaurant offers a menu built around produce from the market garden, the farmyard, the sea and the land, together with a selection of home-made desserts.

QUERIDO MARTÍNEZ

This restaurant at No. 1 Calle de Caracas is a dream come true for three Argentinian friends who grew up together in the Martínez neighbourhood of Buenos Aires. After 30 years bonding over their shared love of hospitality, food and wine, they've now opened a Madrid restaurant serving Argentinian-influenced cuisine alongside a carefully selected range of wines. The wine list features more than 40 labels from Argentina, France, Spain, Italy and other parts of the world. The food menu focuses on dishes for sharing, together with a concise selection of mains such as the crispy escalope, *paccheri rigati* al pomodoro pasta and grilled skirt steak.

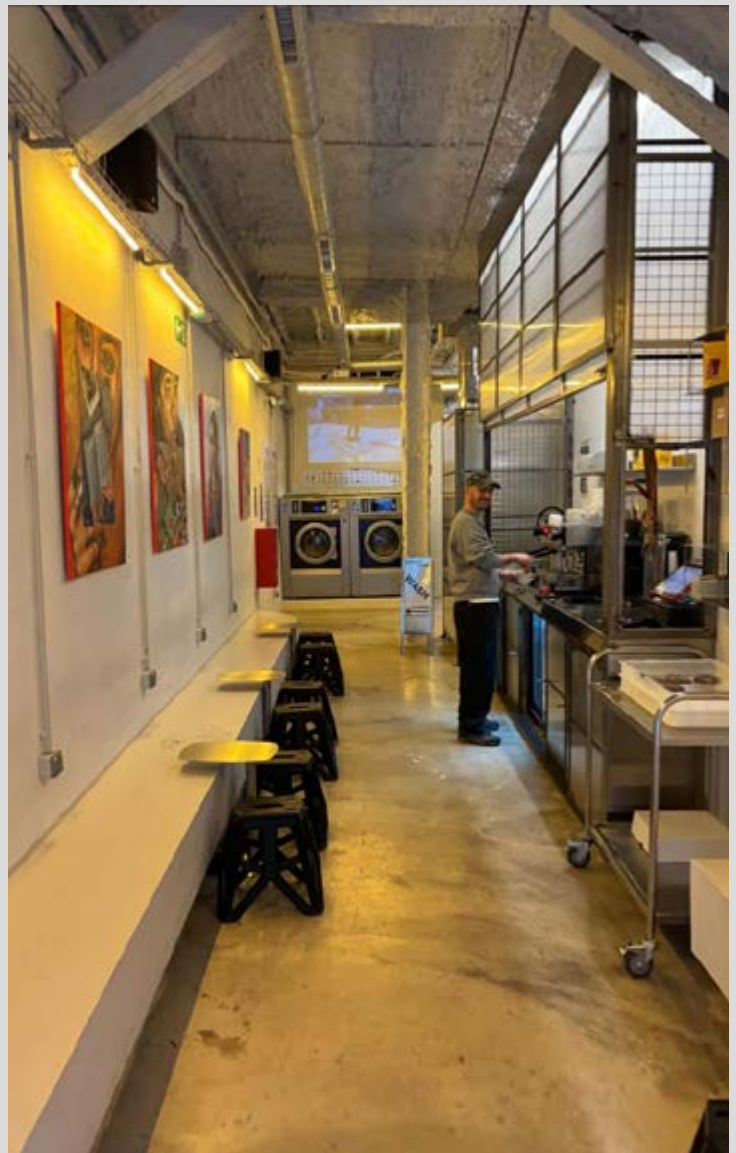

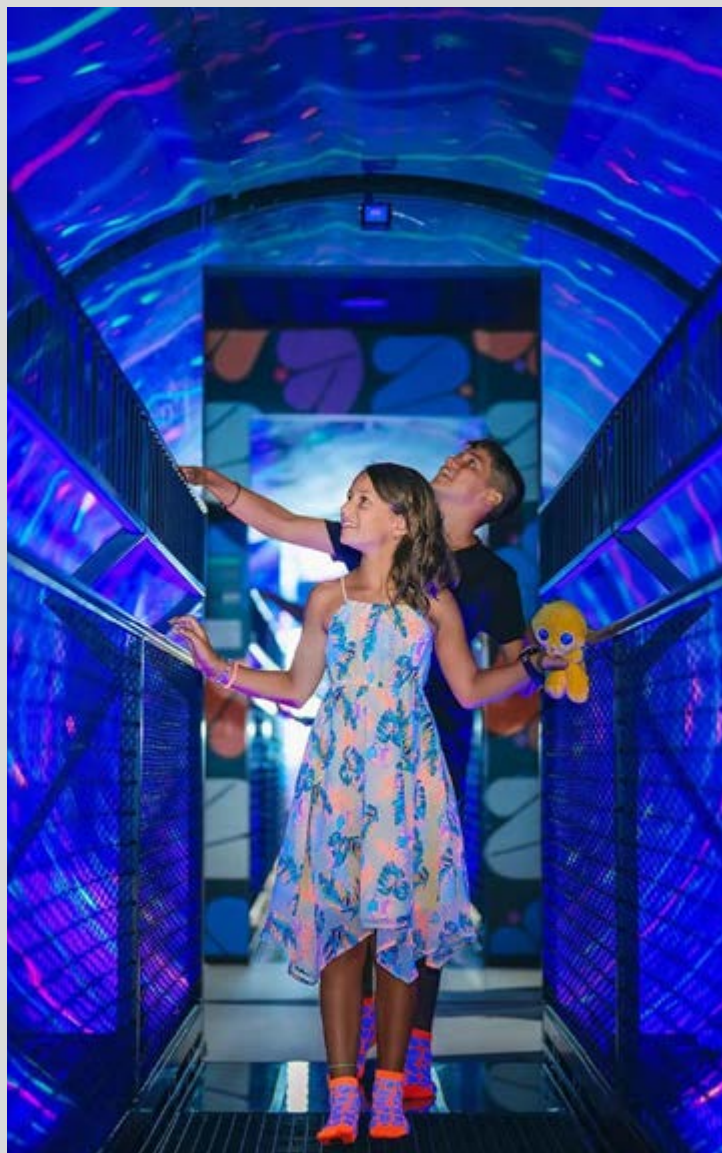

ACCOMMODATION

THE HOXTON MADRID

2027

The hotel group Ennismore is set to open a new hotel in Plaza de Santa Ana, in the heart of Madrid. Featuring 192 rooms, a café, rooftop bar and event spaces, it will mark The Hoxton brand's first establishment in the capital.

DOUBLETREE BY HILTON MADRID PRÍNCIPE DE VERGARA

2026

Hilton is expanding its presence in the capital with a new DoubleTree by Hilton in the Barrio de Salamanca neighbourhood. Set to be the chain's second hotel in Madrid, and scheduled for opening in late 2026, it will feature 155 rooms, a bar, a restaurant, a gym and meeting rooms.

IBERVALLES HOTEL

2028

At No. 27 Avenida del General Perón, in the financial district of AZCA just steps from the Bernabéu Stadium, Ibervalles Socimi is developing a luxury hotel designed by Danish studio Bjarke Ingels Group (BIG) in collaboration with Madrid-based Ortiz.León Arquitectos. The new five-star property will comprise 15 floors, six underground levels and 144 rooms and will feature a striking curved glass façade.

HOTEL CASA PALAZUELO

Coming soon

Casa Palazuelo—one of architect Antonio Palacios's stand-out works, located at No. 4 Calle Mayor—is set to be transformed into a hotel. Built in 1919 and currently used as offices, the project and change of use, will allow for the protected parts of the property to be restored while preserving its structural and formal features.

NEW TRAVELODGE HOTEL

2027

The hotel company Travelodge is opening a modern 90-room hotel at No. 11 Calle de Emilio Ferrari. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2026, with the hotel expected to welcome its first guests in summer 2027.

MEININGER Madrid

2027

This international chain is set to open its first hotel in the capital. The MEININGER hotel will be located at No. 44 Avenida del Mediterráneo, just a short walk from El Retiro Park, and will boast 193 rooms, including a few that can accommodate up to five or six guests.

HOTEL MIGUEL ÁNGEL

2026

Hotel Miguel Ángel is set to reopen in the final quarter of 2026 under the management of one of the Lopesan Hotel Group brands. Following an investment of nearly €250 million, the company plans to recreate the luxury of its resorts in Punta Cana and Gran Canaria in Madrid. It will transform the legendary hotel into the capital's premier luxury destination, complete with exceptional dining and cocktail offerings.

NOBU HOTEL MADRID

2026

September is the month Nobu has chosen to open its first hotel in Madrid. Featuring 50 rooms and suites, the establishment will also boast a restaurant, bar and three-storey Nobu lounge with several different spaces. The rooftop terrace will also offer some of the best views in Madrid, making it an ideal spot to take in the city's spectacular sunsets.

HOTEL GRAN VÍA 60

Coming soon

No. 60 Gran Vía avenue will once again open its doors. The building, which was abandoned more than eight years ago, is best known for its crowning sculpture, The Roman, and for once being the home of Casa Social del Banco Hispano de Edificación—the bank's staff and community spaces. The property will be redeveloped as a hotel with the ground floor reserved for businesses.

KIMPTON HOTEL

2030

El Corte Inglés Group is teaming up with Kimpton Hotels to open its first hotel in Madrid. Set to occupy the building next to the Goya department store, at No. 89 Calle de Goya, it will feature approximately 106 rooms.

HANDWRITTEN COLLECTION ACCOR

Coming soon

Accor's new brand Handwritten Collection has decided to open one of its first hotels in Madrid. Located in the city centre—the exact address is yet to be decided—the boutique hotel will showcase an Art Deco style, quintessential Madrid elements such as Manila shawls and local tiles, as well as other nods to the city's history.

UMUSIC HOTEL TEATRO REINA VICTORIA

Coming soon

The gastronomic group Pescaderías Coruñesas is taking on the hotel industry and it's going all out. Its newest project will

be located on Plaza de Canalejas, in three historic properties: Teatro Reina Victoria, the Meneses Building and Casa Allende. This luxury hotel complex will feature a diverse selection of restaurants, in addition to a cultural space.

HOTEL ILUNION ON CALLE DEL PRADO (ONCE HEADQUARTERS)

Coming soon

The current headquarters of ONCE (the Spanish National Organisation of the Blind) will soon be undergoing a complete renovation which will turn it into a luxury hotel. Boasting a prime location on Calle del Prado, it's expected to feature 116 rooms across six floors.

SOR MADRID

2026

The former headquarters of the UGT trade union, which had previously been the Recogidas Convent, is undergoing works to become a 41-room hotel. The renovation project includes recovering the original façade of the convent, which is currently covered by another brick façade added in 1897. The works will also restore some of the original spaces in the cloister, basilica and courtyard area which had been altered during successive renovations. The former convent, located in the neighbourhood of Chueca, was erected in 1623.

SIR AGUSTÍN LUXURY HOTEL

Coming soon

This luxury hotel is set to open in an early 20th-century building in the Literary Quarter. It will offer 33 rooms, a restaurant, rooftop bar and private members' club called The Cover.

BVLGARI HOTELS

2030

The Bvlgari hotel chain is planning to open a new luxury hotel in the capital. Although the exact location is not yet known, it has been confirmed that it will occupy a lavish building in one of the most luxurious areas of the capital.

SAUDI RSR SINGULAR SOCIMI HOTEL

Coming soon

A new luxury hotel will soon open its doors in the vicinity of Plaza Mayor. The building will have lush vegetation, a rooftop terrace and a restaurant on the ground floor. The deluxe four-star property will be managed by the RSR Singular Assets Europe Real Estate Investment Trust, a company owned by the Saudi Arabian family office of Rashid Saad Al-Rashid & Sons.

HOTEL FOMENTO 2

Coming soon

A new 4-star hotel is set to open in Plaza de Santo Domingo, within the building known as Fomento 2. The hotel will feature 155 guest rooms, a parking garage and a rooftop swimming pool.

SHERATON

Coming soon

Madrid's first Sheraton hotel will be located opposite Adolfo Suárez Madrid-Barajas Airport's Terminal 4. With an area of 10,000 square metres spread over 14 floors, it will boast 200 guest rooms, a swimming pool and other common areas.

GRAN VÍA 3

Coming soon

Located on the main stretch of Madrid's Gran Vía, an avenue renowned for its early 20th-century architecture, historic buildings and landmark establishments, this former office building will soon be converted into a four-star deluxe hotel.

TAYKO HOTEL

Coming soon

Very close to Puerta del Sol and Plaza de Canalejas—Madrid's new Golden Mile—the Byou Hotel chain is set to open a new establishment under its Tayko Hotel brand. With 60 rooms distributed over eight floors, the new four-star hotel will feature a restaurant and a rooftop terrace.

HOTEL AC MARRIOTT

(CORNER OF NO. 11 CALLE DE LA VERÓNICA AND NO. 3 CALLE DE SAN PEDRO)

Coming soon

The AC Marriott hotel chain will open a 65-room establishment in an old deconsecrated and disused church, close to the Prado Museum.

BLACKROCK LUXURY HOSTEL

Coming soon

BlackRock, one of the world's largest asset managers, has acquired a building on Calle de la Virgen de los Peligros, very close to the Four Seasons Hotel Madrid. The firm intends to redevelop the property into a luxury hostel.

RADISSON COLLECTION (GENERALI BUILDING)

2028

Madrid's first Radisson Collection hotel, the most exclusive brand within the Radisson Hotel Group, will be housed in the Generali Building at No. 21 Calle de Alcalá, just steps from Plaza de Canalejas. The hotel will be nestled in an area renowned for its luxury offerings, with top brands like Hermès, Louis Vuitton and Cartier nearby. Spread across roughly 8,500 m², the hotel will have 12 floors that will hold 154 guest rooms and suites designed to provide a one-of-a-kind experience combining elegance with comfort and functionality.

ZEL HOTEL

Coming soon

Zel, the hotel brand created by tennis player Rafa Nadal and Meliá Hotels International, is opening a new hotel on Gran Vía avenue. It will occupy the building of the former Madrid Gran Vía 25 Affiliated by Meliá hotel and is expected to launch as a four-star establishment.

RESTAURANTS

CAFÉ LHardy

Coming soon

The historic restaurant Lhardy will open a luxury café in the exclusive Hotel Wellington at No. 8 Calle de Velázquez in the Salamanca neighbourhood. With its own street entrance, it will span two floors and offer breakfast and brunch options as well as small plates and cocktails.

EVARISTO 33

2026

The renowned Grupo Pescaderías Coruñesas store at No. 12 Calle de Recoletos will reopen as a restaurant offering simple cuisine based primarily on fish and seafood.

FNAC CALLAO

2026

The current building that houses FNAC—the well-known store selling books, movies, music and video games—will feature a rooftop restaurant with great food.

RESTAURANTE NOBU

2026

The famous Japanese chef Nobu Matsuhisa has announced the imminent opening of a new restaurant in Madrid. Located on Calle de Alcalá, the establishment will be attached to the hotel of the same brand, which is also scheduled to open in 2026.

LA ONCE MIL

2026

The acclaimed Mexican taquería La Once Mil, which has one Michelin star, is coming to No. 11 Plaza de las Salesas this summer in partnership with Los 33. Set to open in July, it will retain its original character while introducing new recipes created especially for Madrid and inspired by its new surroundings.

NAVE 12 MATADERO

Coming soon

Matadero Madrid's Nave 12, formerly home to Café Naves and closed for the past 18 months, is set to reopen under the management of Grupo La Fábrica. The revamped space will include a café-restaurant and terrace which will be open to the general public, as well as to those attending activities and staff working at the cultural complex.

CULTURAL SPACES

CASA DE LA POESÍA

2027

Casa de la Poesía, will become the house museum of writer Vicente Aleixandre. The poet's residence, known as Velintonia and a gathering place for artists and intellectuals in the early 20th century, will be transformed into a cultural space in Madrid, opening its doors to mark the centenary of the Generation of '27.

BANK OF SPAIN MUSEUM

2030

2030 will see Bank of Spain open a museum space at its headquarters in Plaza de Cibeles. Designed by Estudio Herreros—the group also responsible for the Munch Museum and the National Museum of China—it will display part of its collection of more than 3,500 works of art and 600 pieces of decorative art and numismatics.

COMPLETION OF THE BONAPARTE TUNNEL

Coming soon

Following the opening of the first section of the Bonaparte Tunnel, restored to its original appearance, a second phase will make it possible to walk its entire length. The tunnel will then fully recover the role Juan de Villanueva originally envisioned for it, as part of an urban ensemble comprising the tunnel itself, the river-side green space and the Puente del Rey bridge, which connects it to Casa de Campo Park.

SALÓN DE REINOS

2028

This imposing building was originally part of the Buen Retiro palace complex. Currently undergoing renovations in a project designed by architects Norman Foster and Carlos Rubio, it's expected to open to the public in 2028 as an exhibition space showcasing the collections of the Prado Museum.

CINEMA MUSEUM

Coming soon

The so-called "NO-DO building", located between Calle de Joaquín Costa and Calle de Velázquez, has been ceded to the Spanish Film Academy to establish the Cinema Museum. The space will be devoted to exhibiting and celebrating Spanish cinematic activity in addition to preserving the country's national film heritage.

CASA DE VARGAS

Coming soon

The Vargas Manor House-Palace and the Felipe II gardens, located in Madrid's Casa de Campo Park and declared an Asset of Cultural Interest (BIC) in the Historical Site category, will soon open as a cultural centre, museum and historical garden. After undergoing renovation, the site will open as a Visitor Centre with a focus on Casa de Campo Park in general and specifically on the Vargas Manor House. The centre will also host a Documentation Centre for Urban Cultural Landscapes, where citizens can

learn about their historical origins. As well as this, the Reserva-
do Chico Gardens (including the fountains and statues) and the
Galería de Burlas former recreational space will undergo renova-
tion. Future plans for changes to the Reservado Grande Gardens
are also in place.

LAS VENTAS METRO STATION

Coming soon

Similar to the museums found in the Nave de Motores de Pacífi-
co power plant, Chamberi Station and the Vestíbulo de Pacífico
entrance hall, the former entrance to the Ventas metro station,
located next to the bullring, will reopen as a museum space af-
ter having been closed for more than half a century.

PALACE OF THE DUKE AND DUCHESS OF OSUNA 2026

Located in El Capricho Park in the Barajas district, the Palace
of the Duke and Duchess of Osuna will reopen following major
renovation work. The building, which comprises three floors
and a basement, will become part of the Madrid City Council
museum network. It will house displays, objects and docu-
ments exploring the history of the estate and the people who
owned, lived in and shaped it, as well as the artistic and intellec-
tual movements that influenced its creation and development.

VAL-VERDE PROJECT

Coming soon

Madrid City Council is to turn the former Clesa factory into a
centre for innovation and research. The building, which opened
in 1962 and was designed by architect Alejandro de la Sota, had
been unused and abandoned for over a decade. After regain-
ing ownership of the premises, the city council will leverage its
potential with a project set to transform it into a cutting-edge
space in Madrid. The 10,500 m² devoted to R&D&I will house
a cultural centre that will host dynamic content, a co-working
space, two auditoriums and a café. A new urban landmark for
both the district, as well as the neighbourhood, is planned and
will come in the form of a large exterior square where people
can gather. The space devoted to culture isn't just one single
part of the building, instead, culture and science are inter-
twined throughout the building.

REAL COMPAÑÍA ASTURIANA DE MINAS 2026

In 2026, the former headquarters of the Real Sociedad Astu-
riana de Minas mining company, located in Plaza de España,
will join forces with Fundación Mutua Madrileña to become a
centre for exhibitions and cultural and social activities.

HISPANIC JEWISH MUSEUM

Coming soon

Fundación HispanoJudía will now have a space from which to
promote its culture and revive the Hebrew historical heritage in
Spain and Latin America. The site chosen is a disused former
electrical substation in the Barrio de Salamanca neighbour-
hood, originally designed by Antonio Palacios.

RAILWAY MUSEUM

Coming soon

Work has begun to renovate the Railway Museum's facilities
and to create new spaces, including a railway library, a room
with high-speed train simulators and a new exhibition area.

STAGE GRAN TEATRO MUSICAL 2027

The building that once housed the former IMAX cinema will be
transformed into Stage Gran Teatro Musical. Following a ma-
jor renovation, the venue will have 1,500 seats and technical
facilities designed for large-scale productions. The production
company, which will operate the venue under a 42-year con-
cession, will debut its programme with the Spanish-language
version of *Moulin Rouge! The Musical*.

TEATRO CONCHA VELASCO

Coming soon

Teatro de Madrid, now renamed Teatro Concha Velasco and
located in the La Vaguada shopping centre, will soon be re-
opened after years of disuse. It will now host large-scale cultural
shows in addition to offering related activities such as a per-
forming arts school.

AEMET MUSEUM (RETIRO)

Coming soon

El Retiro Park is home to a castle that once housed the first
semaphore line of the Astronomical Observatory and the first
building of the Meteorological Institute. After years of disuse,
the castle is being transformed into a new meteorological mu-
seum by Spain's National Meteorological (Agency).

EMT MUSEUM

Coming soon

The future EMT Madrid Museum will be located in the iconic
Madrid Río Park area, one of the city's most renowned loca-
tions. The museum will showcase the rich history of the Ma-
drid Municipal Transport Company (EMT) and will be built on a
4,460-square-metre plot within the Mahou-Calderón complex,
situated between Calle del Duque de Tovar, Calle San Epifanio
and Paseo de los Melancólicos.

PALACIO DE LA MÚSICA

Coming soon

Located at No. 35 Gran Vía, this building was designed by Bil-
bao architect Secundino Zuazo. First opened in 1926, it has
been closed since 2008. Its major three-year renovation finally
got under way in 2025 and will see it transform into a flexible
cultural venue for music, theatre, exhibitions and talks.

SOROLLA MUSEUM

Coming soon

The Sorolla Museum is currently undergoing a major transfor-
mation, including an extension and the refurbishment of the
house museum. The renovation will preserve its original es-
sence—the spirit of Sorolla's home—while enhancing its char-
acter and identity. The new spaces will allow the museum to

expand its services and give visitors even more ways to enjoy their visit. They'll also make room for a broader and more varied programme of exhibitions and cultural activities, introducing new perspectives and approaches while keeping Sorolla and his legacy at the heart of the institution.

SPORTS

CITY OF SPORT

Coming soon

The future City of Sport is to be located in the vicinity of the Riyadh Air Metropolitano Stadium, in the San Blas-Canillejas district. The area of land—which was originally going to form part of the city's application to host the Olympic Games—comprises five undeveloped plots to be used exclusively for sports purposes. The space will welcome various sports facilities, including football pitches, a mini stadium for 6,000 spectators, 25 padel courts, a climbing wall, a surfing area with teaching facilities, a skate and jump zone, an athletics track, and much more.

MADRING

2026

Coinciding with the Formula 1 event in September, this new circuit will open in time to host the Spanish Grand Prix, which will remain in Madrid until at least 2035. MADRING will feature a 5.4-kilometre track with 22 turns, where drivers will reach speeds of up to 300 kilometres per hour.

GEMSWELL SURF MADRID

2027

From 2027, visitors will be able to surf in Europe's largest artificial lagoon, located next to Metropolitano Stadium. The complex will also offer a wide range of dining options, alongside leisure and sports activities.

OTHER SPACES

PALACIO DE EXPOSICIONES Y CONGRESOS

Coming soon

Madrid's Palacio de Exposiciones y Congresos, located at No. 99 Paseo de la Castellana, will soon undergo a large-scale renovation to house the WTO (World Tourism Organization) in its Building B. Building A will also be used to host a wide range of events.

THE NEW BERNABÉU METRO STATION

Coming soon

The Regional government of Madrid has decided to modernise the Bernabéu metro station (Line 10) with a design inspired by Real Madrid's football stadium. The works planned for the coming months include a new interior look and feel to reflect the special relationship between the station and the stadium, the capital's sporting landmark and a major tourist attraction. Additional universal accessibility measures will be introduced to facilitate transport for all passengers, especially those with reduced mobility.

MADRID TELEFÉRICO

2027

Scheduled to reopen in 2027, the revamped cable car will offer an innovative, sustainable experience, while meeting the highest standards of accessibility at both stations (Pintor Rosales and Casa de Campo). It will also have 47 panoramic cabins, each accommodating up to 10 passengers.

MADRID MUSIC DISTRICT

Coming soon

Madrid Music District is set to transform the former Aquatic Centre into a multi-purpose complex devoted to entertainment, sport and education. It will focus its activities around three major areas: an indoor music arena with capacity for more than 20,000 people, an educational campus for 2,300 students led by UAX Group, and a sports centre managed by GOFit with capacity for 9,000 users.
